Russ Get Several Ships, Langer Says

WASHINGTON — (J.E.) — The secrecy-shrouded question of whether American warships have been transferred to the Russian fleet grew in stature Friday with the claim by Sen. William Langer, (R-N. D.), that a number of cruisers of the old Omaha type apparently have been turned over to Russia under terms of the Italian armistice.
