SLAVS' PART IN U. S. WAR EFFORT IS POINTED OUT

CLEVELAND, May 29—(AP)—More than half the heavy war production workers of the U. S. are of Slavic descent, Leo Krzycki of New York City told members of the American Slav Congress here today.

"Washington figures show," the president of the congress and vice president of CIO Amalgamated Clothing Workers, related, "that 51 per cent of the sweat and energy that are being poured into heavy war production comes from workers of Slavic descent.

The congress held a one-day parley at which a resolution was adopted urging President Roosevelt to accept a fourth term.
