

Sinatra Squelches Screams On Wednesday Radio Program

It looks like a sincere statement on the part of Frank Sinatra has hushed up the screaming of the teen age fans who invariably are among the ticket holders for his Wednesday night program heard over WABC at 9 p. m. EWT.

Just before the show goes on the air, Frank now says that there will be no studio audience for his half-hour show in the future if there is any screaming during the singing numbers. "Laugh if you want to during the comedy sequences, applaud if you like after numbers," says Sinatra, "but PLEASE—NO screaming during the vocals."
