CORNCOBS SEEN USED IN CHEMICAL FIELD

CHICAGO, June 22—(UP)—The corncob, useful in the past only for starting fires in farm belt kitchens and for the home-made pipes of corn belt philosophers, is facing a new future, according to the Chicago Daily Drovers Journal.

Chemistry has found corncobs valuable for use in synthetic rubber, plastics insulation material and for other purposes, the newspaper says, and a small-scale market for them already has been developed.

G. F. Spertler, Logan county, Ill., has adapted an old mill, set it up beside a switch track, and equipped it with a hopper that holds six tons of cobs. He grinds them into cob meal for a chemical factory.
