RISE NOTED IN VIOLATIONS OF WAGE PROGRAM

CLEVELAND, June 27 — (UP). — O. W. L. Coffin, vice chairman of the Regional War Labor Board, believes that a two-months report of the enforcement division of the WLB reflected "a rising tide of subterfuge and evasion" of the wage stabilization act.

Coffin said the report showed that total findings of \$155,045, ranging from \$100 to \$15,000, had been returned against 63 Ohio, Kentucky and West Virginia firms in the two months
