A musical tribute to George M. Cohan is aired by Dr. Frank Black, in his concert broadcast with Lucille Manners, soprano, and Ross Graham, baritone, on Friday at 8 p. m., over Station WEAF. Included in the medley are "Yankee Doodle Boy," "Mary Is a Grand Old Name," "Harrigan," "You're a Grand Old Flag," "So Long Mary" and "Over There." The orchestra and chorus also present "My Temptation" and "Dancing Tambourine." Miss Manners sings the "Jewel Song" from "Faust," and "Flower of Love." Graham's solo is "Thy Beaming Eyes."

## RECOVERY OF \$6,299.36 FROM STATE REPORTED

Recovery of \$6,299.36 from the state of Ohio for costs paid by Allen-co, the City of Lima and the City of Delphos in connection with state criminal cases between 1935 and 1940 was reported Friday by Clerk of Courts Ernest Mills.

Of the total amount received from the state, \$5,242.01 went into the county treasury as fees for the clerk's and sheriff's offices. Another \$950.10 went to the Lima municipal court treasury while the remaining \$100.25 went into the treasury of the Delphos mayor's court.

Mills disclosed he has been attempting to obtain this settlement for three years and a half. The costs accumulated in cases in which the defendants were sentenced to state institutions.

Meanwhile, about the same amount of costs are due Allen-co again for the period between 1940 and 1944, the clerk pointed out. He expects to apply for these in a short time.
