

"Lovely Lady" Is Dramatized On "Cavalcade Of America"

A turning-point in the invasion of Sicily, on which the entire campaign is said to have hinged, is dramatized on "Cavalcade of America" Monday (WEAF, 8 p. m., EWT.)

Titled "Lovely Lady," the drama opens on a mountain in Sicily which an entire American division must descend to support an armored attack against the enemy. The impossible must be overcome to accomplish the mission, but the division sets out to do it. On the way down the mountain trail, a deep chasm where the Germans have blown away the road is confronted. The engineers, and especially Pvt. Minelli, driver of a bulldozer named "Lovely Lady," work to bridge the gap in one day where ordinarily four would be insufficient. How Minelli, a former tight-rope walker in the circus, performs the miracle of stringing the bridge together — and receives a promotion while doing it — is told in the climax of the story.
