**U. S. Corporation Control Urged**

WASHINGTON — (U.P.) — The joint congressional economy committee, declaring that government corporations have grown so powerful that they rival government itself, has urged prompt action to make them subject to closer control by congress.  
The recommendation was made in a report, based on nearly two years of study, in which the committee, headed by Sen. Harry F. Byrd, (D-Va.) revealed that government corporations had grown in number from 10 to 44 in the 13 years ending June 30, 1943.
