

"Gang Busters" Dramatize Life Of Giant Murderer

"The Case of Kinnie Wagner," a dramatization of the life and crimes of the infamous hill-billy murderer and jail breaker who sported five notches in his gun belt, will be concluded on the "Gang Busters" broadcast, Friday at 9 p. m. over WJZ.

Wagner, a cold blooded killer who stands six feet, two inches in his bare feet and whose bone and muscle tips the scales at 240 pounds, was already becoming a legend a

few years ago when he was in Blountsville jail, Tennessee, awaiting trial for murdering a policeman, a deputy sheriff and critically wounding another deputy.

With eyes fastened on the promising post-war world an octet of Waves and sailors will sing "Make Way for Tomorrow" on the WJZ broadcast of the all-star revue, "Meet Your Navy," Friday at 8:30 p. m. EWT.

Chief Specialist John Carter, former Met Opera tenor who recently returned from entertaining Navy personnel in the Pacific War Theatre, will sing "Quicquid Mucio," and Bluejacket Harvey Crawford will serenade with "Goodnight, Wherever You Are."
