950 Strike in State

WAUSAU - (U.P.) - Protesting against War Labor Board (WLB) delay in acting on contract onestions, about 700 wood workers went on strike at the Silbernagel plant in Wausau Friday and 250 walked out at the Anson-Gilkey mill in Merrill.

Spokesmen for the strikes, members of the AFL Carpenters and Joiners union, said they sought to hasten WLB action on wage stabilization and other issues. Both plants were shutdown. The Silbernagel mill, manufacturing ammunition cases, was not picketed, but there were about 50 pickets Friday morning at the gates of the Merrill plant. They said that they st had been working without a contract since January, 1942. They voted 145 to 11 in favor of striking and notified WLB to that effect 30 days ago under the Smith-Connally act.
