

# Francis Scott Key Honored On Anniversary Broadcast

Celebrating an historic event that has even greater significance in 1944, WJZ will open at dawn, Thursday, the 130th anniversary of the writing of the Star Spangled Banner by Francis Scott Key.

The network will go on the air at 5:30 a. m. EST, an hour and a half before its regular opening time, with a special 15-minute program which will originate at Ft. McHenry, just outside of Baltimore, Md. "By the dawn's early light,"
