One of the outstanding early-season football games will be described by Bill Stern, ace sportscaster, when he takes his microphone to the Great Lakes (Ill.) Naval Training station for the Great Lakes-Purdue university tilt Saturday over Station WEAF at 1:15 p. m., EST.

Great Lakes, represented by the leading service eleven in the country last season, is expected to have another national contender built around Jim Mello, former Notre Dame fullback star. Purdue, 1943 Big Ten co-champion, is likely to be a title contender again this season. Returning stars include Dimancheff and Elliott, both ball carriers.
