

# Jack Benny, Mary And Phil Return To Air On Sunday

Jack Benny returns to the air Sunday over Station WEAJ at 6 p. m., EST. Fred Allen will be a special guest to celebrate the start of Jack's Lucky Thirteenth season on the air waves. No holds will be barred, and while boxing gloves aren't written into the script, the program producer will have them handy.

Jack will have the gang back with him. Mary Livingstone, the gal friend who heckles him even as she loves him; Phil Harris, the baton-wielding mug who surprised his boss this year by learning to read; Rochester, factotum of the Benny household who sees that his boss' suits don't wear out hanging idle in the closet; and Jack's announcer for these past 12 years, Don Wilson.

"The Sleigh" by Richard Koontz and Ernest Charieg' "Clouds" are the John Charles Thomas solos on the "Westinghouse Program" Sunday, over WEAJ, 1:30 p. m., EST.

Maestro Victor Young's own "Sweet Sue" will be given a Ken Darby treatment by the chorus along with "The Most Beautiful Girl in the World" by Rodgers and Hart.

half hour again will be in the hands of John Nesbitt, storyteller, and Young will contribute orchestral versions of Marie Gébriell's "Le Cinquante" and the popular "Tico Tico." As the program's closer, Thomas will join the ensemble for Romberg's "One Alone" from the "Desert Song."

Riley buys a large gaming table to serve as a dining room table for the occasion, but when the meal is ready a secret latch is tripped accidentally, the table top drops and the food lands in the guests' laps. That's just the start of a typical "The Life of Riley" mixup, in which one belly laugh follows another. Supporting Bendix as Riley are Sharon Douglas as Babs, Paula Winslowe as Mrs. Riley and Conrad Binyon as Junior.

Musical works by the great Norwegian composer, Edvard Grieg, have been selected by conductor Frank Black for the Sunday program of the General Motors Symphony of the Air over WEAJ, 4 to 5 p. m. EST.

The gifted young American pianist, Earl Wild, will be soloist for the featured work, Grieg's famed Piano Concerto in A Minor. The performance will mark the second time that Dr. Black and Wild have presented the Grieg concerto with the NBC Symphony Orchestra, the initial occasion being a year ago.
