## REGISTRATION IN DETROIT IS NEARING RECORD

DETROIT, Oct. 14 — (AP) — Registration of voters for the general election Nov. 7 neared a record in Detroit today, with three registration days remaining and 50 neighboring stations operating 12 hours a day to accommodate those certifying their eligibility.

Nearly 6,000 voters were registered Thursday, bringing the total in the city to 718,492. The record, registered for the 1940 general election, is 721,267.
