

Violinist To Be Soloist On Boston Symphony Airing

Dr. Serge Koussevitzky and the Boston Symphony orchestra, on Saturday, from 7:30 to 8:30 p. m., Lima time, over WJZ, commemorate the 110th anniversary of the first performance in Paris of Berlioz' "Harold in Italy" symphony. William Primrose, noted violist and leader of the Primrose quartet, will be the soloist. For his opening number, Dr. Koussevitzky has selected "Pinochio, a Merry Overture" by Ernest Toch, contemporary Viennese composer, now living in Los Angeles.

Effervescent Billie Burke, star of stage and screen, is set to announce her triumph over politics when she fulfills the engagement—originally scheduled a few weeks ago but cancelled because of a major political broadcast—on the Barry Wood-Patsy Kelly

show over WEAJ Saturday, at 10 p. m.
