

# Capt. Don Gentile Slated For Interview Over WLW

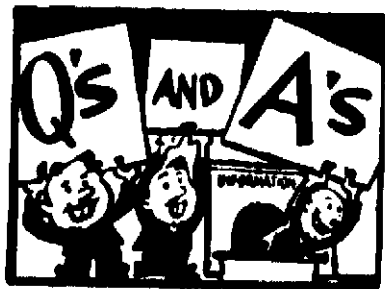
## CAPT DON GENTILE — Sunday RADIO
