

Use Of Force To Keep Peace To Be Debated On Broadcast

The question whether our membership in a world security organization should deprive congress of its constitutional right to declare war will be debated on "America's Town Meeting of the Air," when four prominent speakers debate the topic, "Should the American Representatives in a World Organization Have Power to Commit Us to Use Force?" in the broadcast Thursday at 7:30 p. m. over Station WJZ.

Sen. Claude Pepper (D-Fla.), a member of the Senate Foreign Relations committee and a leading pre-Pearl Harbor spokesman for the cause of intervention, and Sen. Joseph H. Ball (R-Min.), member of the Senate Committee on Appropriations, argue that for prompt action against aggressors, power to employ force should be delegated to our representatives in a world council. Sen. Chapman Revercomb (R-W Va), member of the Senate Military Affairs committee, and John T. Flynn, lecturer, economist and author, take the opposite viewpoint. George V. Denny, Jr., is moderator.
