Orson Welles, actor, writer and producer, tries something new, when he co-stars with Orson Welles in Sinclair Lewis' "Willow Walk," on "This Is My Best," Tuesday at 8:30 p. m., Lima time, over Station WABC. He plays both leading roles, in the story of a bank clerk who plans a robbery, and as an "accomplice," creates a mythical twin brother who is an evangelist. "Willow Walk" is an unusual type story for Lewis, first American author to be awarded the Nobel Prize for distinction in world literature.
