The dramatic, but seldom publicized story of Ann Newport Royal, the one woman feminist movement, will be presented by "Cavalcade of America," on Monday, at 7 p. m., Lima time, over Station WEAJ.

"Witness for the People" will present Fay Bainter of the screen and Ray Collins as the key figures in the early battle to obtain equal rights and suffrage for women. Ann Newport Royal was a newspaper reporter in the days when the industry was regarded as "for men only." Her bitter struggle paved the way for the triumphant entry of women into other arts, sciences and professions. Robert Armbuster composes and conducts the original background music.
