WOMAN GRANTED EXECUTION STAY

COLUMBUS, O., Dec. 6—(INSY)—Johnnie Mae Gardner, who was scheduled to become the second woman to die in the Ohio penitentiary electric chair Friday night, today was granted a 45-day stay of execution.

Convicted to die along with two men for the brutal slaying of Jacob Reinstatler, aged Cincinnati jeweler, Johnnie Mae's death penalty conviction has been accepted by the court of appeals for review. The court's action in accepting the case automatically postponed the scheduled execution.
