AKRON TRANSIT WORKERS WILL STRIKE MONDAY

AKRON. O., Dec. 9—(AP)—Maintenance men of the Akron Transportation Co. will strike at 2 a. m Monday, a spokesman for the AFL International Association of Machinists said today as officials of the CIO Transport Workers Union expressed willingness to work out a settlement in a threatened strike in the rubber capital's transportation system.

D. Lyle Mahan, AFL business agent representing the mechanics, said 110 employes would walk out unless demands for increased pay denied by the War Labor Board last October were met.

Bus drivers and street car operators voted earlier to strike next Monday in an effort to secure similar pay increases, but William H. Wright, CIO local president said "we still are willing to work out a solution."
