

Richard De Rochemont To Appear On Town Meeting

Richard de Rochemont, national president of France Forever and producer of the motion picture series, "The March of Time," and Lewis Gannett, author and newspaperman just returned from France, round out the roster of speakers for "America's Town Meeting's" discussion of the puzzling question, "Can France Regain Her Place as a World Power?" Thursday at 7:30 p. m., over Station WJZ. De Rochemont joins Leon Henderson, former director of the OPA who recently visited France, in maintaining that France will rise again. Gannett and Louis Fischer, author of the recent book, "Empire," argue that France will remain a second-rate power. George V. Denny, Jr., moderates.

"Love's Lovely Counterfeit," James M. Cain's thrilling story of murder, politics and racketeers, is heard on "Suspense" with Humphrey Bogart in the starring role, on Thursday, at 7 p. m., over Station WABC. Bogart is cast in the role of an ex-convict who comes under the influence of a political racketeer and lives to regret it

when the gangster stands in the way of his rehabilitation. The former prisoner narrowly escapes being murdered before the story comes to a thrilling finish. The show is produced by William Spier.
