

Chinese Educator Joins U. S. Admiral In Program

Dr. Y. C. James Yen, founder and general director of the Chinese Mass Education Movement, joins Adm. Harry E. Yarnell, U. S. Navy retired, and Otto Tolischus, author and former Tokyo correspondent, in a discussion of the question, "How Should We Deal With a Defeated Japan?" on "America's Town Meeting" over Station WJZ, Thursday at 7:30 p. m.

Yarnell is former commander-in-chief of the Asiatic fleet. Tolischus, author of "Tokyo Record" and the soon-to-be-published "Thru Japanese Eyes," was imprisoned and tortured by the Japs, following the outbreak of war, and was returned to the United States later as an exchange prisoner.
