Stilwell Has Yen To Secure Infantry Badge

WASHINGTON, Mar. 20—(AP)—Gen. Joseph W. Stilwell, who already can wear most of the medals in the book, has a yen for still another. But he can't have it.

The medal, the Army disclosed today, is the combat infantryman badge awarded for satisfactory performance in ground combat against the enemy.

Stilwell, chief of Army ground forces, has had plenty of such experience. But there's a catch. The infantryman badge goes only to "officers, warrant officers and enlisted men" assigned to infantry regiments, battalions and
