## Federal Worker Held In Thefts

COLUMBUS, O., Apr. 10—(AP)—Jackson Love, 54, formerly of Springfield and an employe of the veteran's hospital at Dayton, pleaded innocent upon arraignment today before United States Commissioner Robert W. Newlon on charges of thefts of government property at the hospital.
