

Discuss Food Shortages On Town Meeting Program

Four experts discuss the reasons behind our food situation, when they debate the question, "Is the Present Food Shortage Necessary?" in an "America's Town Meeting" broadcast from New Orleans at 7:30 p. m. Thursday over Station WJZ. Sen. Allen J. Ellender (D-La) and Norris E. Dodd, chief of the Agricultural Adjustment Agency of the War Food Administration, maintain that the shortage is necessary, and are prepared to cite the facts to prove their case. Ranson Aldrich, president of the Mississippi Farm Bureau Federation and another expert will argue that we are carrying far more than our share of the responsibility for feeding other nations, and that our armed forces are stockpiling food at the expense of the civilians. George V. Denny, Jr., founder of "America's Town Meeting," presides as moderator.
