

Moral Standards Topic On "America's Town Meeting"

"Are We Losing Our Moral Standards?" Irene Dunne, film star, says yes, Orson Welles, motion picture actor, writer, producer, and host of the radio series, "This Is My Best," says no, when that question is debated on "America's Town Meeting," in a broadcast from Los Angeles Thursday, at 8:30 p. m., over Station WJZ. The program is the first of five marking the 10th anniversary month of "America's Town Meeting" which broadcast for the first time in May 1935. George V. Denny, Jr., founder of the forum, presides as moderator.
