

# Russia, U. S. In Post-War Period Is Town Hall Topic

"America's Town Meeting," the forum series which presents authorities for both sides on controversial questions of national and international importance, marks its 10th anniversary with a debate on the question, "America and Russia—Post-war Rivals or Allies?" in the broadcast at 8 30 p. m. Thursday over Station WJZ. Taking the position that the emergence of Russia as a leading world power will make that nation a rival of the United

States will be William Henry Chamberlin, author of the book "Collectivism—A False Utopia," and for 12 years Russian correspondent for the Christian Science Monitor; and Norman Thomas, chairman of the Post-war World Council and standard-bearer of the Socialist party. Taking the viewpoint that Russia and the United States will be post-war allies will be Raymond Moley, former Assistant Secretary of State, author, radio commentator and columnist for Newsweek Magazine; and Raymond Swing, veteran radio news analyst.

Hollywood star Ronald Colman stars in W. F. Harvey's unusual thriller, "Summer Heat," the story of an artist who has his

death foretold, on "Suspense," at 8 p. m. Thursday over Station WABU. During an intense heat wave, an English artist sees the vision of a courtroom where a convicted criminal is awaiting sentence.
