

Price Ceilings In Post-War Period Is Town Hall Topic

Whether or not price controls should be retained during the period of reconversion which will follow victory will be the debate topic, as "America's Town Meeting" rolls into its 11th year of broadcasting, with the forum at 8:30 p. m. Thursday, over WJZ. Leon Henderson, former director of the Office of Price Administration, now chairman of the board of directors of the Research Institute of America, will be one of two experts speaking for the affirmative on the question.

"Should the Lid Be Kept on Prices During Postwar Reconversion?" Two equally prominent authorities will argue against a continuation of price controls, maintaining that there is no danger of inflation caused by competitive bidding for commodities, when those commodities are being produced in sufficient quantity to meet demand. George V. Denny, Jr., founder of "America's Town Meeting," is moderator.

The aiming circle, a piece of fire

control equipment which enables our artillery to attain great accuracy in blasting enemy positions, is the subject of "Weapons for Victory," the Army Service Forces drama series, in the broadcast over Station WABC at 5 p. m. Thursday. A representative of a company which manufactures these precision instruments will be on hand to describe the making of the equipment. The drama will demonstrate the aiming circle's effectiveness in controlling artillery fire on Okinawa.
