CAMP PERRY, July 30—(INS)—The Army gave Ohio and Northern Indiana farmers new relief from their labor shortage today with the announcement that one thousand more German prisoners-of-war have arrived at Camp Perry.

Col. William H. Dunham, Jr., post commandant, revealed that the Germans, all former members of the Nazi navy, arrived yesterday from Camp McCain, Miss., to increase to nearly six thousand the POW's assigned to Camp Perry.
