

Joe E. Brown To Be Guest On 'Sports Parade' Program

Joe E. Brown, famed comedian whose love for baseball is so great he almost chose the national sport as a career instead of the stage and screen, will be the guest of "The Sports Parade" on the broadcast at 5 p. m. of Saturday, over WOR. This program, consisting of roundups of famous athletes, will be from Los Angeles, and Joe will talk of his favorite game in his own inimitable manner.

"They Walk Again," first of two programs dramatizing the readjustment of a returning soldier who lost his limbs in combat, will be presented on the Army Service Forces "Assignment Home," when it airs Saturday at 10:15 p. m. over station WABC. In this first half of the two-part story, the drama shows the Army's preparations, both physical and psy-

chological, to ready the veteran for his return to civilian life. This is an encore performance of a script by Arthur Laurents, first broadcast last February.

Roy Acuff offers two oft-requested favorites, "I'm Sitting On Top Of The World" and "Where Could I Go But To The Lord," on the "Grand Ole Opry" show at 10:30 p. m. Saturday over Station WEAJ.
