

Actors' Lab To Repeat Show, "Lust For Life" Thursday

Arch Oboler has enlisted members of the Actors' Lab, a group of well-known Hollywood actors and actresses, for the repeat performance of "Lust for Life," his original radio adaptation of Irving Stone's biography of Vincent Van Gogh, which will be broadcast over WOR Thursday at 10 p. m.

Lt. Jackie Coogan, screen actor recently discharged from the Army Air Forces after extensive overseas service and decorations; Maj. Ted Lawson, one of the pilots on Gen. Doolittle's first bombardment of Tokyo, and co-author of "Thirty Seconds Over Tokyo;" and the Hon. Earl Warren, governor of California, will be three of the four speakers, when "America's Town Meeting" discusses the question, "Will the Returning Soldier Be a Problem?" in the broadcast Thursday, at 8:30 p. m., over Station WJZ. Coogan answers the question in the affirmative, Lawson and Warren in the negative, in a forum originating at the Santa Ana Army Air Base, Santa Ana, Calif. George V. Denny, Jr., is moderator.

The story of the Army Service Forces' 2,000-pound general purpose demolition bomb, used for knocking out large ships, concrete dams, heavily fortified enemy positions and entire war production plants, will be told on the Army Service Forces "Weapons for Victory," Thursday, at 5 p. m., over Station WABC. The series is written by Pvt. Lawrence Menkin, and directed by Maj. Andre Baruch. Warrant Officer Edward Sadowsky conducts the music.
