WLB Releases Voluntary Wage Boost Appeals

CLEVELAND, Aug. 27—(AP)—Some 1,600 voluntary wage increase applications from Ohio, West Virginia and Kentucky have been released as a result of President Truman's relaxation of wage controls to speed reconversion. Chairman Frederick H. Bullen of the Regional War Labor Board, announced today.

Bullen said the biggest single factor in the recently-announced executive program initiating the return to a peacetime economy was the release of 16,000 such wage applications thruout the country.
