Her success in modeling a head of Dagwood leads to an attempt to do a life mask of Dagwood's boss, J. C. Dithers. The mask is so realistic that they can't tell it from Dither's own face . . . and they can't pry it from his face either! With typical Bumstead luck, Dither's liability suddenly and dramatically becomes an asset, and all ends happily. Penny Singleton and Arthur Lake are heard as Blondie and Dagwood, with Hanley Stafford as Dithers.
