

# Radio Will Try Its Hand At Portraying Life Of O. Henry

The life of one of America's most beloved short-story writers, William Sidney Porter, known to millions of readers as O. Henry, will be depicted at 7:30 p. m. Friday over WOR on the program "Freedom of Opportunity."

The same vivid drama and heartbreak which pulses thru O. Henry's literary works are to be found in the poignant story of his own life, in its struggles, defeats and the final success which placed him among the immortals of American letters.

Richard Hoffman, noted psychiatrist, criminologist, author and poet, returns as guest to "Leave It To the Girls," the laugh-provoking feminine round table on problems of romance,

which can be heard over station WOR at 9:30 p. m. Friday.

Dr. Hoffman's native wit and versatility will be called into full play as he exchanges remarks with four sharp-tongued career girls.
