

Winning Sweepstakes Ticket Provides Clue In Murder Story

A winning Irish Sweepstakes ticket and an exhumed corpse provide the telltale murder clues in the story "Post Mortem," to be dramatized at 10 p. m. Friday over NBC in "Mystery Theatre."

A search for a \$150,000 winning ticket in the Irish Sweepstakes prompts the opening of a long-covered grave—and leads to the discovery of a murderer's well kept secret.
