WAGES INCREASED AT CELINA FIRM

Contract Signed With Union After Negotiation

CELINA, Dec. 18—As the result of negotiation, a contract has been concluded between the Mersman Brothers Corp. and the Upholsterers International Union whereby increased benefits and income will be given to the employees of the company, it was announced today by Walter J. Mersman, president of the firm.

Among other provisions, night shift employes will receive a 10 per cent bonus, employes with five years or more service will have vacation pay benefits increased to two weeks, and day and piece workers will receive an increase respectively of 5 cents and 5 per cent per hour. The latter will amount to more than \$100,000 annually.
