

Helen Forrest To Present Unusual Song Hit Saturday

One of the most unusual songs of recent years is Helen Forrest's choice for her featured ballad, when she sings "Happiness Is a Thing Called Joe," at 8 p. m. Saturday over CBS on the "Dick Haymes Show."

Introduced originally by Ethel Waters in the picture "Cabin in the Sky," the song is scheduled for the melodious Forrest treatment, backed by the music of Gordon Jenkins and the 31-piece orchestra. Miss America herself, otherwise known as 21-year-old Bess Myerson of the Bronx, N. Y., and Gloria Dalton, beauty consultant to Harry Conover, model-maker, will sit in as guest members of the glamor girl panel on "Leave It To the Girls" to be heard at 9 p. m. Saturday over MBS. They will join Madge Evans and Eloise McElhone in the fast-moving ad lib discussion of problems of courtship and marriage.

Larry Stock, long known as one of Tin Pan Alley's brightest musical lights, will appear as the featured guest songwriter on "Tin Pan Alley of the Air," to be broadcast at 5:45 p. m. over NBC.

Among Stock's long list of favorites are "The Umbrella Man," "Blueberry Hill" and the currently popular "That Feeling In The Moonlight."

"The Sobbin' Women," will be Helen Hayes' dramatic offering on the weekly broadcast heard at 7 p. m. Saturday over CBS.
