

Moe Jaffe, Guest Saturday, On 'Tin Pan Alley' Program

Moe Jaffe, one of the leading American songwriters, will appear as the featured guest on "Tin Pan Alley of the Air" broadcast coast-to-coast over the entire NBC network at 5:45 Saturday.

Jaffe's songwriting career dates back to the early twenties when he wrote the hit tunes for the University of Pennsylvania "Mask and Wig" shows. During the past year, he was acclaimed at Carnegie Hall for writing the outstanding 1945 success, "Bell Bottom Trousers."
