## Plan Research In Vegetables

COLUMBUS, Jan. 22—(UP)—Ohio State university today announced a \$100,000 program of research in the production and marketing of vegetables.

The Ohio State researchers, working in a field in which study was interrupted by the war, will seek to develop improved machinery, new weed-control measures, improved plant breeding methods and ways to control plant diseases.

Other projects are planned in the marketing field, including work on packaging and transportation of farm produce.

Professor Howard D. Brown of the university's department of horticulture said \$100,000 in contributions would be asked, the interest to be used to employ graduate students for work in this research.

### PLAN NEW QUARTERS

CINCINNATI, Jan. 22—(AP)—New quarters housing the Gruen National Watch Case Co., subsidiary of Gruen Watch Co., will be constructed here under a \$1,000,000 expansion program designed to increase production facilities 50 per cent. The program
