Nebraskans Aid Vet's Job Training

LINCOLN, Neb., Jan. 26—(UP)—Nebraskans are cooperating to the hilt in the state-wide drive to provide returning veterans with training for the jobs they seek according to Wayne O. Reed, state superintendent of public instruction

Nearly every type of work now is represented by the 281 employers offering 900 approved "on-the-job training" vacancies, he said

Under the training program set up by the GI Bill of Rights, employers make application to Reed's office. If they can show they are equipped to train vet-
