

Taft, Stassen, Brownell To Speak on GOP Program

Four leading spokesmen for the Republican party will participate in a special Lincoln's Birthday broadcast over MBS at 11:30 p. m. Tuesday.

Notables whose voices will be heard include those of Herbert Brownell, Republican party chairman, speaking from New York City; Senator Robert A. Taft, of Ohio, in an address from Kansas City, Mo.; Clare Boothe Luce of Connecticut from Nashville, Tenn. and Harold Stassen, former governor of Minnesota, from Boston, Mass.
