

Vox Pop Show Originates In Kokomo, Ind., on Monday

For a Vox Pop broadcast about the world's most popular sport, basketball, Parks Johnson and Warren Hull will stop at Kokomo, Ind., the U. S. hotbed of the hoop game, "where every kid is born with a basketball in his hands." Interviews with players of all ages from Kokomo's 118 teams will be broadcast at 8 p. m. Monday over CBS.

Virtually every youngster in Kokomo plays the action-packed game from 10 years until he's physically unable to maintain the pace. Some 1,180 boys and men, on teams drawn from YMCA, Hi-Y clubs, Boy Scouts, elementary, high and Sunday schools and industries participate in seven leagues that determine the city championships.
