

Truman, Wallace To Speak Saturday Night Over MBS

President Harry S. Truman and Secretary of Commerce Henry A. Wallace will be heard in a special program over MBS at 10 p. m. Saturday on the occasion of the Jackson Day dinner to be held at the Mayflower hotel in Washington, D. C.

Secretary Wallace will open the program and his address will occupy the first half of the broadcast. The speech of the President will be heard on the second half of the program. The "Chicago Theatre of the Air" will be heard for one half hour only, 10:30 p. m., on this date.

Presenting a galaxy of screen and radio stars, the MBS network will commemorate the 34th birthday of the Cimpfire Girls with a special program at 5:30 p. m. Saturday.

Outstanding singers and entertainers to be heard include Eddie Cantor, who will act as master of ceremonies, Patrice Munsel, brilliant young soprano of the Metropolitan Opera; Jean Hersholt, known to both radio and screen audiences as Dr. Christian; Earl Wrightson, baritone radio favorite; Burl Ives, well-known concert and radio ballad singer and a host of other stars.

Buddy Kaye, writer of "Till the End of Time," winner of the Clef Award as the outstanding song hit of 1945, will appear as the fea-

tured guest songwriter on "Tin Pan Alley of the Air," over NBC at 5:45 p. m. Saturday.

S. Sgt. Johnny Messner will wield the baton as leader of the 378th Army Air Forces Band when Danny O'Neill, song star, and Patty Long, popular vocalist, appear as guest stars on the Army recruiting program "Men of Vision" at 3:30 p. m. Saturday over MBS.
