Sunspots Cause Magnetic Storm

WASHINGTON, Apr. 25—(UP)

—Vast sunspots about 20 times the area of the earth are stirring up a magnetic storm which has been interfering with communications since midnight Monday, the National Bureau of Standards said today.

Chiefly affected by the current sunspot activity, according to Miss J. V. Lincoln of the bureau, is North Atlantic short wave radio transmission to Europe.

Miss Lincoln said the magnetic storm probably would last thru Thursday. She forecast a lull of one day and then a recurrence of
