The Great Gildersleeve, known to his friends as Hal Peary, will be the comedy guest on the Bob Crosby show at 8:30 p. m. Wednesday over CBS.

Hal Peary made his radio debut as a Spanish troubadour. Finding many other male singers struggling along, he changed over to comedy.

David Rose's springboard to fame, his pulsing melody "Holiday for Strings," will be highlighted in a new arrangement by the composer-conductor for his weekly original contribution to the "Holiday for Music" program at 9:30 p. m. Wednesday over CBS.

Rose wrote the musical hit in 45 minutes. His records alone have exceeded a million. He had used it as a keyboard device to escape playing the piano at Hollywood parties.

Master Detective Ellery Queen will have two singers, Elsa Miranda, radio's Chiquita Banana, for his guest armchair sleuth and a criminal with a different tune on his "Adventure of Cokey and the Pizza" at 6:30 p. m. Wednesday over CBS.

Inspector Richard Queen, Ellery's father, wants Cokey Cox to sing in the worst way and the Cokey is no Caruso, his song will jail a dangerous mob for 20 years.
