

War Vets Central Figures In Murder Show Monday

A group of war veterans who return to this country only to find themselves involved in another kind of battle are the central figures in "The Case of the Taxicab Murders," to be heard on the "Adventures of Bulldog Drummond" at 7 p. m. Monday over MBS.

Drummond and his aide, Denny, attempt to help the ex-GIs in their efforts to form a taxicab company, but find themselves in a tough spot when a group of rival cabbies try to keep their monopoly on the taxicab business.

Jackie Coogan, as "Ernest Tripp," becomes involved in a bathing beauty contest situation on "Forever Ernest" at 7 p. m. over CBS. Ernest enters a picture of Duke's girl in the competition, unaware that his own sweetheart, Candy Lane, wants to win the pulchritude crown. A local hardware store sponsors Candy's photograph.
