Sweet, Swing Music Spotted On 'Music Hall' Thursday

Both sweet and swing music hold the limelight on the "Music Hall" program at 8 p. m. Thursday over NBC. Emcee Eddy Duchin will open playing a medley of "All the Things You Are" and "Sweet Sue." Edward Everett Horton, Vocalist Milena Miller and the King Cole Trio with Russ Case and his orchestra will be on hand to do their regular weekly stints.

Maestro Gordon Jenkins loses a chord and then finds it, in the gay operetta tabbed "The Lost Chord," featured number on the "Dick Haymes Show" at 8 p. m. Thursday over CBS.

The Jenkins man, aided by such musical cohorts as the Four Hits and a Miss, the 36-piece orchestra and the Suitcase Six, ambles thru a rhythmic evening strewing a pocketful of notes along the way. Among the melodic tidbits to be heard are "Jericho," with the band and the chorus, "Blue Moon" and "All Thru the Day," plus a demonstration of Jenkins' own one-finger piano technique in "They Say its Wonderful."
