WASHINGTON, Aug. 2 — (NEA)—The symbol of every veteran of World War II, the Unknown Soldier, will soon be brought back to America and rest in permanent glory. Congress has passed a bill which provides for the selection and return of an unknown serviceman. The War department is working out the details.

This unknown soldier, sailor, marine, or coast guardsman will be placed beside the Unknown Soldier of World War I in Arlington National cemetery, according to present plans.

The method of selecting the fallen hero has not been definitely set.
