

# 'The Small Servant' For Bette Davis'

Bette Davis, two-time Academy Award winner, stars in "The Small Servant," an original one-act play by Charles Dickens' "The Old Curiosity Shop," the first Hollywood Players' program.

This humorous story, broadcast at 8:30 p. m., is a contrast to Miss Davis' usual heavy emotional work with a small servant in the home of Samson Brass, a London solicitor.

The servant, portrayed by Miss Davis, lives on pathetically frugal fare and is locked up nightly after her chores are finished. But she finds a key and gets out!

Six lovely lassies, chosen from among the candidates for the Atlantic City "Miss America" crown, will step up to the microphone for the first official test of their radio IQ, in a unique quiz program to be conducted by Todd Russell, emcee of "Double or Nothing," at 9:45 p. m. over MBS.
